

## New Rules Governing Disciplinary Enforcement For Attorneys Effective January 1 November 15, 2013 – Nashville, TN Tennessee Bar Center

## **The Program Description:**

On August 30, 2013, the Tennessee Supreme Court adopted a comprehensive amendment, effective January 1, 2014, overhauling the rules governing disciplinary enforcement for attorneys. This program will review the new, amended Rule 9 in detail. Marisa Combs and Hugh Kendall, co-chairs of the TBA subcommittee that played a large role in putting together the "receiver attorney" provisions ultimately adopted by the Court, and Brian S. Faughnan, Chair of the TBA Ethics Committee, will provide attendees of the seminar with a guided tour of what's new, what's unchanged, and what may continue to be controversial going forward in 2014.
